If we have lived on this earth a very long time, we have experienced pain, disappointment, heartache, and sorrow. We have lost dear loved ones through death. Sometimes we feel as though we are going through these great losses alone. No one can understand the depth of our pain. Other times, we experience a great loss corporately. Like the 9-11 disaster, where we were glued to our TV sets, watching the horror unfold before our eyes. Feeling helpless. Hoping those we know could get out of harm's way.

Other times, the sorrow we feel is a loss of innocence, in very private and dark moments in our life. A feeling of powerlessness. The knowledge that we can't stop something that is horrible, shameful, and disgusting even when it is happening to ourselves.

Even as Christians, there are experiences in our life we seem totally unprepared for; A sick child, a car accident which snatches away a loved one, a devastating illness which results in years of turmoil.

Some of us have a better understanding than others of how to reach out to God in these times of need. We don't even know how to share our hurts with the body of Christ, our brothers and sisters God gave us to carry each others' burdens.

He will shine a light on every dark place in your heart, and you will experience a new dawn in your life. Ask Him. He is ready to help you.
